

Facts about Water and Wastewater Service in the 21st Century



- Average utility has been increasing rates 5-6% per year, trend expected to continue
- AWWA forecasts that water and wastewater rates across the U.S. will triple in the next 15 years
- Rate adjustments are primarily due to reasons beyond a utility's control – Wholesale providers passing along cost increases, inflation, Capital Improvement Plans, etc.
- Increased federal and state regulations on water and wastewater treatment are also leading to higher costs
- 30-40% of utilities charge rates that do not cover their costs





Today's Presentation – Factors and Objectives



Factors impacting City of Cibolo's rates:

- \$11,946,001 in capital improvements over next 3-5 years that serve development flowing to the North CCMA WWTP are needed to overhaul and expand system;
- CCMA South WWTP requires expansion to serve future growth. There is an opportunity to partner with new development to fund infrastructure; and
- Operating costs increasing

- Length of rate plan: 3 or 5 years






Historical and Forecast Water and Wastewater Accounts

Average Annual Increase = 230 accounts (3.04%)




Wastewater
Average Annual Increase = 324 accounts (2.47%)






Test Year and Forecast Annual Water Billed Consumption

10 Year Forecast Primary Assumptions



- Biggest Impacts on Rate Plan (See next slide)
 - Increase in CRWA Operational Costs, Water Purchases, and Regional Water Participation Costs
 - Increase in CCMA WWTP Operational Costs at WWTPs along with South Plant Expansion
 - Debt issued for the Design (\$3.825M in late 2025) and Construction (est.
 \$33.75M with payments beginning in 2027) to expand CCMA South WWTP
 - Debt required to fund CIP
- Other Recurring Impacts on Rate Plan (See next slide)
 - Most personnel and operating expenses increase 3.0% per year
 - Certain expenses (insurance/workers comp/health care) increase at higher rates
 - Certain expenses will increase with volume and customer growth (electricity/chemicals)






FY 2026 Cost of Service






CIP Project Funding FY26 – FY30

Notes on Rate Proposal



- Recommend implementing a 3-year rate plan with first adjustment in January 2026 and additional adjustments in October 2026 and October 2027
 - A 3-year plan will allow the City to re-evaluate rates after the CCMA South Plant design is complete, and CCMA enters into a construction contract for the expansion in mid-2027; the CCMA South WWTP timeline shows construction to start around August 2027.
 - Re-evaluate wastewater rates in 2027 for 2028 and beyond
- City has option of extending the proposal to a 5-year plan
- No change in current rate structure
- Rate plan should be reviewed annually due to potential changes in operations and CIP

Rate Plan Impact on W & WW Monthly Charges






Impact of Rate Proposal












Summary and Next Steps



 Rate plan is required to maintain utility's financial health, fund CIP projects, and finance CCMA South WWTP expansion

Request direction from Council on following:

- Confirm use of Impact Fees to fund CIP to greatest extent possible to reduce new debt; and
- 3 year vs. 5 year rate plan implementation
