A. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Chairperson Miller called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm in the City Hall Council Chambers, located at 14717 Burin Avenue, Lawndale, CA 90260.

Commissioner Owens (arrived at 6:36 pm)

B. FLAG SALUTE

Commissioner Castro led the flag salute.

C. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. Approval of the Minutes from the January 12, 2026, Commission Meeting

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins and seconded by Chairperson Miller to approve the January 12, 2026, minutes as written.

Motion carried 4-0, with Commissioner Owens absent.

D. PRESENTATIONS

None.

E. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS – Items not on the agenda (Public Comments)

None.

F. COMMENTS FROM COMMISSIONERS

Vice Chairperson Wood – Mentioned that she attended the parade planning meeting, and asked about sharing her notes.

Commissioner Collins – Asked about the status of Rudolph Park.

G. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

2. Lawndale Beat Ridership Report – January 2026

Director Minter briefly mentioned the report and that staff were working with a consultant for some state reporting related to Zero Emission Vehicles. Vice Chairperson Wood made a motion to approve the minutes. A second was made by Commissioner Collins.

Motion carried 5-0. (Commissioner Owens arrived at 6:36 pm)

3. Operation of a Fireworks Stand

Director Minter opened the discussion sharing that staff had submitted an application on behalf of the Commission per the guidelines of the Fireworks program. He then asked the Commission to provide direction as to whether or not the Commission wanted to pursue a stand in 2026 and what key tasks staff could assist with for the process.

Chairperson Miller discussed the lack of volunteers and the impact on the commissioners running the booth, and that he'd seen the movie before.

Vice Chairperson Wood commented that they committed to it in 2025 and wanted to maintain that commitment for 2026 with a positive mindset.

Commissioner Owens asked if Pastor Harbison could attend a meeting and talk about scheduling and/or workload for hosting a booth.

Commission Collins recommended soliciting volunteers with a specific shared goal that might increase interest and commitment levels.

After additional discussion, Chairperson Miller asked for concurrence from the Commission. Commissioner Owens expressed her support for whatever the Commission wanted to do, but that she would not be participating with anything related to fireworks. The rest of the Commission shared their concurrence, and they will be moving forward with plans for a booth in 2026.

Commissioner Owens asked about donations, and whether or not the Commission and the Trust Fund was able to take donations to the Trust Fund. Staff replied that they would look into it.

Some of the tasks to be done include modifying the flyer and translating it to Spanish. Vice Chair Wood offered to attend City Council and make an announcement. Chairperson Miller said he would assist with that.

Each commissioner talked about agencies, businesses, or groups they would target, as well as city events. It was also asked if other Committee members and/or Commissioners were eligible to serve as volunteers as well.

Additional discussions will be included on the next agenda as well.

4. Movie on the Lawn

Director Minter introduced the topic and staff report. He shared that staff were working with the LA County Public Library Lawndale Branch on a joint partnership between the Youth Advisory Committee, the Library, and the Parks, Recreation and Social Services Commission to host a movie on the lawn in the Lawndale Civic Center. He informed the Commissioners that in the past the PRSSC had supported the event that was held indoors on the 3rd floor of the Hofmann Community Center, with PRSSC paying for the movie and popcorn.

The proposed event would be an outdoor movie, as requested by both the Library staff and the Youth Advisory Committee. The first year the goal would be to host a single event in late

August on the Civic Center lawn. The library would pay for the movie license, with a request that the PRSSC sponsor the movie screen, projector and sound equipment, all through one vendor. The current estimate was roughly \$1,100. Staff would work with other partner organizations to provide arts & crafts activities and food booths for the public. Restroom access would be available through the library.

After a brief discussion, Vice Chairperson moved that the Commission approve the concept for the Movie on the Lawn program. Staff will bring back a request to approve a Resolution with the actual cost for the movie screen and related services. Chairperson Miller seconded the motion.

Motion carried 5-0.

7. Youth Day Parade: Saturday, April 25

Director Minter stated that planning meetings are beginning, and updates will be provided monthly as we moved towards the parade. The Youth Advisory will have an opportunity to serve as the Grand Marshalls for this year's parade, so hopefully everyone can attend.

RE: Operation of a Fireworks Stand in 2026

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

For many years the Parks, Recreation and Social Services Commission (PRSSC) has operated a Safe and Sane Fireworks Stand in the City of Lawndale. The PRSSC has been given permission to operate a Fireworks Stand each year, regardless of how many applications are received by the Finance Department.

During the last Commission meeting, the discussion focused on the need for volunteers to make the Fireworks stand possible. Staff have created a draft flyer specifically for the Fireworks Stand (Attachment A). With the Commissions' approval, staff will begin posting it on the website, Community Services message boards, and on the City social media channels. Flyers will also be printed for the Egg Hunt, Youth Day Parade, Spring Music Festival, and the newly re-titled Family & Pet Health Fair, should the Commissioners choose to have a booth at those events.

There is an opportunity for Commissioners to star in a video encouraging community members to sign up to be a volunteer. Staff will work with the Cable TV division to set up a day/time that works for you. The video would be edited and posted on the City's various social media platforms as often as we'd like to help get the message out to the public.

Looking ahead, there is a Mandatory Fireworks Stand Meeting on April 6, 2026, at 5:00 pm in the City Council Chambers. This would be a great opportunity to have a representative from the Commission in attendance. After the meeting there would be an opportunity to ask questions of the other two agencies.

Staff also need direction from the Commission regarding the two fireworks vendors, and how the Commission would like to move forward with the selection of the vendor.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend that the Commission review the draft flyer, identify at least one member that can attend the April meeting, and give staff direction on fireworks vendors for the next meeting.

RE: Approval of a Resolution approving the use of Trust funds for the Movie on the Lawn event

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Over the years the Parks, Recreation and Social Services Commission (PRSSC) has supported the Youth Advisory Committee's request for financial support of a Movie Night in the Harold E. Hofmann Community Center. During the February meeting staff presented the Commission with a request for funding to sponsor a Movie on the Lawn event in the Lawndale Civic Center. The Movie on the Lawn event is currently scheduled for Friday, August 21, 2026, and will be co-sponsored by the Youth Advisory Committee and the Lawndale Public Library (LA County).

Community Services staff met with Library staff to start planning the event. It was identified that the Library would be sponsoring the movie licensing and provide restroom access during the event, with the PRSSC potentially sponsoring the inflatable screen, sound system, and projector (typically this all comes in one service agreement). The Community Services Department will also be working with local food vendors, contract instructors, and partner agencies to provide food options, arts and crafts, and other activities to entertain families.

Community Services staff contacted representatives from *FunFlicks Outdoor Movies* for a quote for the rental of the screen, sound equipment, and projector for the lawn area between City Hall and the Library. The quote provided has been attached for your review (Attachment A).

During the February meeting, the Commissioners provided consensus that they would be interested in sponsoring (or co-sponsoring) the movie, and staff agreed to return to the meeting in March with a Resolution for the use of the PRSSC Trust Fund. Staff have provided the current Trust Fund Balance (Attachment B) and a list of the Trust Fund allocations from the last 7 years (Attachment C) for your review.

RECOMMENDATION

At this time staff are requesting that the Commission approve Resolution 1103-26 (Attachment D) authorizing the expenditure of PRSSC Trust Funds for the rental of an inflatable movie screen, sound equipment, and project from *FunFlicks Outdoor Movies* for the Movie on the Lawn event to be held on Friday, August 21, 2026.

RESOLUTION NO. 1103-26

A RESOLUTION OF THE PARKS, RECREATION AND SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAWNSDALE, CALIFORNIA APPROVING THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS TO *FUNFLICKS OUTDOOR MOVIES* FOR A MOVIE ON THE LAWN EVENT TO BE HELD ON FRIDAY, AUGUST 21, IN THE LAWNSDALE CIVIC CENTER.

WHEREAS, Lawnsdale Municipal Code ("LMC") Chapter 3.10 establishes the procurement policies pursuant to which the City's Parks, Recreation and Social Services Commission ("PRSSC") may spend the funds raised by the PRSSC's fireworks booth operations; and

WHEREAS, LMC Section 3.10.020 authorizes the PRSSC to procure supplies, services and equipment with funds raised by the PRSSC if a majority of the PRSSC approves the expenditure after considering the purchase as a properly agendaized item at a regular public meeting of the PRSSC; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2026, at a regular meeting of the PRSSC, the PRSSC considered whether to authorize the expenditure of funds for the rental of an inflatable screen, sound equipment, and projector for a Movie on the Lawn Event in the Lawnsdale Civic Center on August 21, 2026.
