A. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Vice Chairperson Collins called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm in the Harold E. Hofmann Community Center 2nd Floor Meeting Room, located at 14700 Burin Avenue, Lawndale, CA 90260.

B. FLAG SALUTE

Commissioner Owens led the flag salute.

C. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. Approval of the Minutes from the June 8, 2026, Commission Meeting

After a brief review a motion was made by Commissioner Miller to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Vice Chairperson Collins.

Motion carried 3-0, absent Commissioner Castro and Chairperson Wood.

F. COMMENTS FROM COMMISSIONERS

Vice Chairperson Collins said thank you for the additional trash cans at Jane Addams Park. She also commended PW for their prompt response to a graffiti callout she submitted. She mentioned damaged playground equipment at JAMS and some dangerous fencing. She also was happy to see the increased enrollments for the tap/ballet class.

Commissioner Owens asked about the rumors of staff turnover in the city.

Vice Chairperson Collins asked about the Beautification Committee and if staff could inquire about the PRSSC sponsoring a utility box near a park and bring it back on a future agenda report.

2. Lawndale Beat Ridership Report for June 2026

Director Minter introduced the report. Commissioner Owens asked about changes to the routes including the LAX transit center. Director Minter shared info about that process, the funds necessary, and that it would likely be a consultant that would be hired for that process. A motion was made by Vice Chairperson Collins, with a second from Commissioner Owens.

Motion carried 3-0 absent Commissioner Castro and Chairperson Wood.

3. Parks, Recreation and Social Services Trust Fund

Director Minter introduced the staff report. After a brief discussion Vice Chairperson Collins stated that she would be okay removing it from the agenda and discussing it during the budget process for the next fiscal year. The Commission agreed through unanimous consent with the Vice Chair.

H. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Minter briefly discussed Lemonade Day and answered questions from the Commission about the program. He then invited the Commissioners to attend the City Council Meeting on Monday, July 20, to celebrate Parks Make Life Better month in Lawndale. He then introduced the Public Viewing Event scheduled for Sunday, July 19, where the City would be hosting a watch party for the World Cup 2026 Final. He handed out flyers for the event.

Director Minter briefly discussed the LESD special election item as previously discussed at the June meeting.

Finally, Director Minter asked if the Commission had any special requests for the upcoming events in terms of giveaways and/or tabling.

RE: Utility Box Art Sponsorship

During the June Commission Meeting, Vice Chairperson Collins requested information about the Beautification Committee's *Art in Public Places* program that beautifies the City by wrapping the Utility Boxes in the City with art. The request included the possibility of beautifying utility boxes close to parks. Staff inquired with the liaisons to the Beautification Committee who were able to provide the following information:

- The boxes cost about \$525.00 to wrap
- There is currently funding available from a development project to complete another dozen boxes or so
- The PRSSC is welcome to submit requests and/or ideas as to what they would like to see
- The PRSSC would not be required to pay for the wrap or design
- There are two utility boxes at the intersections adjacent to Jane Addams Park have utility boxes that can be wrapped
- Jane Addams is the only park that is adjacent to an intersection that would have utility boxes

At this time the Commission can discuss the opportunity to submit a request to the Beautification Committee with design ideas, locations, and any other details that may be relevant to the request. As there is funding available already, the Commission would not have to approve a resolution or use any of the PRSSC Trust Fund balance.

If the Commission reaches consensus as to the request for a box, a member of the Commission can attend the next Beautification Committee meeting to share the request, or a written request can be forwarded from the Chairperson to the Beautification Committee to consider for their next meeting. Staff have provided photos of other boxes that have been completed in the City along with the two options near Jane Addams Park (Attachment A).

Staff recommend that the Commission review the information above and provide direction to staff regarding this request, including approval of a theme, location, and description, if possible.

RE: Approve Resolution for purchase of Movie on the Lawn Items

During the Commission meeting on July 13, 2026, Community Services Director Jason Minter asked the Commission if they would like staff to provide options for activities or giveaways for the upcoming Movie on the Lawn Event scheduled for Friday, August 21, in the Lawndale Civic Center. The Commission agreed and recommended that staff bring forward items along with a Resolution for the Commission to review and potentially approve.

Staff have purchased three (3) items already as the lead times for shipping would not guarantee arrival before the event date. The three (3) items are as follows (Attachment A):

- Mini Dragon Eye Bouncy Balls (120 total)
- Dragon Gliders (196 total)
- Color Your Own Mini Dragon Gliders (96 total)

The total cost for these items including tax was \$187.67 (Attachment B). Should the Commission wish to approve the use of PRSSC Trust Fund for this purchase, the Commission needs to approve the attached Resolution (Attachment C). If approved, the Trust Fund Balance would be \$28,921.49 (Attachment D). Staff will provide a table during the event for the Commission to hand out these items along with candy and/or information about upcoming programs.

Should the Commission choose not to fund the items included in this report, or if the Commission would like to only approve the purchase of a portion of the items, the changes will need to be made to the Resolution but it can still be approved during the meeting. The Community Services Department would fund the purchases through the Mobile Recreation Program and have everything available in the Mobile Rec Program area.

It should be noted that the PRSSC has previously approved the use of Trust Funds for this invent that include the rental of the blimp screen, projector, and sound system for the event in the amount of \$1,019.32, which was approved on March 9, 2026.

The Staff Recommendation is for the Commission to approve Resolution 1104-26 approving the purchase of dragon themed giveaway items for the August 21, 2026, Movie on the Lawn event in collaboration with the Lawndale Public Library.

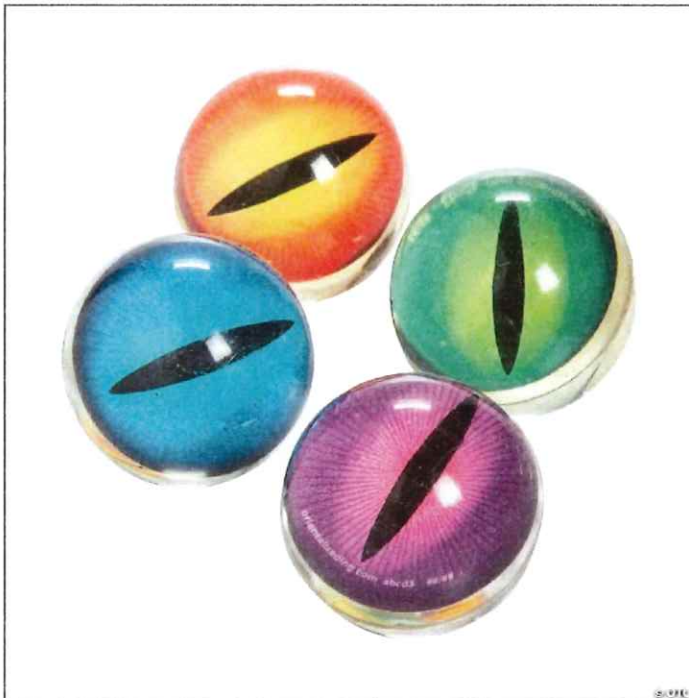

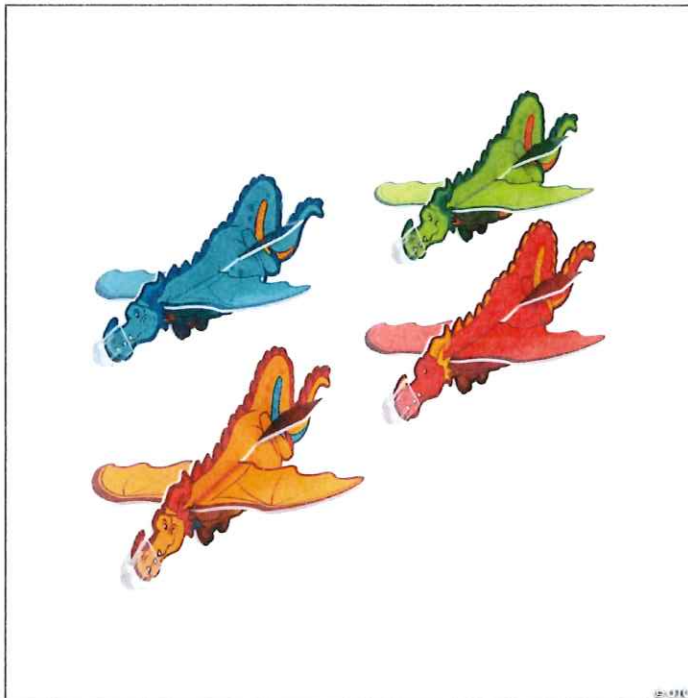

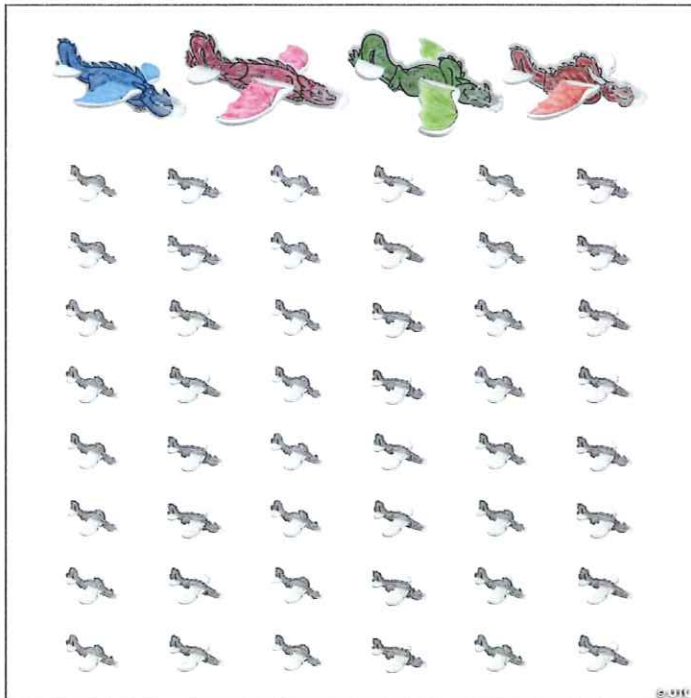

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARKS, RECREATION AND SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAWNSDALE, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. That the PRSSC has reviewed account statements demonstrating that PRSSC Fireworks Trust Fund Account includes sufficient funds to make the purchases being considered.

SECTION 3. That the PRSSC hereby approves the expenditure not to exceed \$187.67 of the funds raised by the PRSSC for the purchase of dragon themed giveaway items from Oriental Trading Company as selected by the PRSSC members to be used for a free community movie event to be held on Friday, August 21, 2026.

SECTION 4. That the PRSSC's staff liaison is hereby directed to undertake such actions as may be necessary to donate the funds contemplated herein on behalf of the PRSSC.
