2.A. Action regarding minutes from the October 21, 2025, meeting--Vicky Vega, City Secretary Council approved the minutes for the October 21, 2025, meeting.

This item was approved through the Consent Agenda.

2.B. Action regarding proposed price increase by Waste Connections Lone Star. Inc., for residential and commercial trash service and residential recycling--Lee Howell, Asst. City Manager

Council approved Per the City's contract with Waste Connections Lone Star, Inc., annual rate adjustments are limited to 5% maximum, regardless of any increases in the urban consumer price index. This year, the CPI-U not seasonally adjusted increased 6.5% year over year 2024-2025 (Sept to Aug). Waste Connections requests the maximum rate increase of 5%, effective with the November 2025 billing cycle. The total monthly rate for a residential customer would be \$15.57 plus tax per month.

This item was approved through the Consent Agenda.

2.C. Action regarding Ordinance No. 2025-27, amending the Master Fee Schedule by amending the fee for Residential Trash and Recycle Services--Lee Howell, Asst. City Manager

Council approved Ordinance No. 2025-27, amends the Master Fee Schedule to reflect the new monthly rate of \$15.57 plus tax for residential trash and recycle services.

This item was approved through the Consent Agenda.

2.D. Action regarding the renewal of the Range Contract with Tarrant County College-Russell Ragsdale, Chief of Police

Council approved the renewal of the Range Contract with Tarrant County College. The Saginaw Police Department utilizes the Tarrant County College Firearms Range for mandatory TCOLE firearms training. The cost for the three year contract is \$22,500. This fee has remained the same since its inception.

This item was approved through the Consent Agenda.

2.E. Action regarding an Advance Funding Agreement (AFA) with the State of Texas through TXDOT for a traffic signal light at E. Bailey Boswell Road and Jarvis Road--Trenton Tidwell, P.E. City Engineer

** Item was Removed from Consent

City Engineer Tidwell briefed the Council regarding the Advance Funding Agreement (AFA) with the State of Texas through TXDOT. Mr. Tidwell explained that the AFA is an HSIP project, which is a grant project that Kimley-Horn applied for to fund the installation of a new traffic signal light at the intersection of E. Bailey Boswell Road and Jarvis Road The project will also include adding an eastbound left turn lane and removing the current median.

This item was previously discussed at the Traffic Safety Advisory Board meeting on May 1, 2025. Concerns had been raised regarding the illegal turns taking place at the location and requests from nearby residents for signage to improve safety. Mr. Tidwell made a suggestion during the Traffic Safety Advisory Board meeting to install a traffic signal light at that intersection, which the Board supported.

Council also discussed alternative options; the proposed signal light was determined to be the safest solution. Three requests were received to speak regarding the proposed traffic signal light from Amy Huynh, Secretary of the Bar C Ranch Home Owners Association, Kelly Schilling, Vice President of the Bar C Ranch Home Owners Association, and Suzie Timler resident.

Kelly Schilling addressed the Council that she attended the Traffic Safety Advisory Board meeting back in May and the City Council meeting back in September and expressed that she is not against the intersection but the concern is the no left turn out of the neighborhood. She also discussed that since the installation of the no left turn sign, she is pleased with the result and has seen a difference. At the Traffic Safety Advisory Board meeting it was suggested adding a couple of stop signs to help slow down drivers. Staff confirmed the signs have been ordered and it will take 6-8 weeks for the signs to arrive. Once installed, the intersection and new traffic signal light will be monitored and evaluated for the effectiveness.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro-tem Felegy and seconded by Councilmember Morrison to approve item as presented. Motion passed unanimously. 7-0-0-0.

2.F. Action regarding an Advance Funding Agreement (AFA) with the State of Texas through TXDOT for the construction of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements Project to North Basswood Blvd from the intersection of Blue Mound Rd to the intersection of Redding Dr. & Include the Intersection of Grand Central Parkway--Trenton Tidwell, P.E. City Engineer

Council approved an Advance Funding Agreement (AFA) with the State of Texas through TXDOT for the construction of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements Project to North Basswood Blvd from the intersection of Blue Mound Road to the intersection of Redding Drive and including the intersection of Grand Central Parkway. The scope of work for the project consist of concrete curb ramps in accordance with TXDOT PED-18 and Public Right of Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG), 5' concrete sidewalk, integral concrete retaining walls and integral concrete curb, and pavement marking replacement where needed. The City's estimated cost is \$46,084.00 and the cost will be paid from account #06-4059-45-00.

This item was approved through the Consent Agenda.

2.G. Action regarding an Individual Project Order (IPO) for Elkins Drive Pulverize Overlay--Randy Newsom, Director of Public Works

Council approved an Individual Project Order (IPO) with Kimley-Horn and associates to provide professional services for project "Elkins Drive Pulverize and Overlay". The scope of work will consist of preparation of construction documents, pavement markings and signage, traffic control plans, sidewalks, specifications, as well as project management and coordination tasks. The Limits are from McLeroy Blvd and Kay Lane. Total amount for professional services is \$49,000.00, and this amount will be paid out of the Street Maintenance Fund.

Describing a specific agreement between Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. (Kimley-Horn), and The City of Saginaw, TX (the City or Client) in accordance with the terms of the Master Agreement for Continuing Professional Services dated <u>April 17, 2012</u>, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Identification of Project: Pavement Management Program Update

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

The Client desires to update the pavement management program encompassing the City's roadway network. The project will involve use of automated data collection equipment to collect pavement condition data and curb/gutter data. Kimley-Horn anticipates collection on a maximum of 102 miles of roadway. Data collected during the assessment will be used to populate a pavement management system (PMS) to help prioritize roadway maintenance and rehabilitation projects according to various funding scenarios.

SPECIFIC SCOPE OF BASIC SERVICES

Task 1 – Data Collection and Integration

Through our subconsultant International Cybernetics Company (ICC), Kimley-Horn will complete a comprehensive pavement data collection effort using high-speed automated equipment. Task 1 involves the collection and integration of data and asset inventories into the PMS.

Task 1.1 - Pavement and Asset Data Collection

Pavement and asset data collection will be coordinated with the City in advance of data collection according to the roadway network. Data collection will be completed by ICC using its IrisPRO Pave data collection vehicle that is equipped with a laser crack measurement system (LCMS-2), inertial profiler, and Ladybug 5+ right-of-way imaging system. Data will be collected in accordance with ASTM D6433 standards and the Data Dictionary developed and approved by the City. Collection will generally occur in one direction unless otherwise identified by the City. The City-approved network definition shapefile developed will indicate collection direction for in-scope roadways.

Task 1.2 – Data Integration

Upon confirmation of the pavement distress data and asset inventory data, Kimley-Horn will populate the DRIVE tool with condition and inventory information. The integration process will contain final confirmation of parameters related to treatment types, local cost data based on recent paving contracts, maintenance trigger values, and budget constraints that will be used when conducting various budget scenarios. Pavement performance models will be developed based on current conditions, surface type, functional classification, and past work history.



ADDITIONAL SERVICES

Any services not specifically provided for in the above scope will be billed as additional services and performed at our then current hourly rates. Additional services may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Capital Improvement Project (CIP) selection and sequencing
- Geotechnical investigations, including coring and boring
- Ground-penetrating radar (GPR) or non-destructive testing (NDT)
- Structural inspections on bridges

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

The City of Saginaw originally entered into a Chapter 380 Economic Development Agreement with SP SA Development LLC on September 25, 2023. The purspose of the agreement was to promote commercial development and economic growth within the city. The first amendement to the agreement was executed on September 9. 2024, to modify certain terms and conditions related to the project. SP SA Development LLC has requested a second amendment to the 380 agreement, the proposed amendment would allow two restruants and an access drive located to the south of the property, providing a connection to the existing parking lot a 1001 N. Saginaw Blvd.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Under the proposed amendment, the City will provide a Restruant Grant Payment in the amount of \$27, 833 to SPA Development. This payment will be made upon the issuance of Certficate of Occupancy for two qualifying food establishments, that are not chicken based resturants or a donut shop.

The grant payment will be paid out of the FY2025-26 Economic Developement Escrow balance.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 380 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS AND SP SA DEVELOPMENT, LLC

This SECOND AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 380 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT ("Second Amendment") is made and entered into by and between the CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS, a Texas municipal corporation within Tarrant County, Texas ("City"), and SP SA DEVELOPMENT, LLC a Texas limited liability company ("Developer"), each of which may be referred to as "Party" and jointly referred to as "Parties," acting by and through their respective authorized officers and representatives, for the purposes and considerations stated below:

WHEREAS, the Parties previously entered into the Chapter 380 Economic Development Agreement on September 25, 2023, and a First Amendment to the Chapter 380 Economic Development Agreement on September 9, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to amend the Agreement to allow for the Developer to construct two restaurants and an access drive to the south of the property connecting to the parking lot located at 1001 N. Saginaw Blvd; and

WHEREAS, the recitals in the Agreement are incorporated into this SECOND AMENDMENT as if fully set forth herein, and defined terms shall have the meaning as assigned to such terms in the Agreement, unless otherwise defined herein.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and promises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

A. <u>Section 1.</u> The definition of Restaurant Grant Payment is amended to read as follows:

RESTAURANT GRANT PAYMENT means a payment of Twenty-Seven Thousand and Eight Hundred Thirty Three Dollars (\$27,833) upon the issuance of two certificates of occupancy for two (2) food establishments, that may not be either a chicken based restaurant or donut-only shop, and the City's final acceptance of a drive crossing to the south of the property connecting to 1001 N Saginaw Blvd. This drive shall be installed per the City's standard detail specifications and build requirements.

- B. <u>Section 4.2.</u> Section 4.2 is amended to read as follows:
 - 4.2 <u>Conditions of Restaurant Grant Payment.</u> In consideration of City agreeing to pay the Developer the Restaurant Grant Payment in accordance with terms, provisions, and conditions of this Agreement, Developer agrees to the following, which are not obligations of the Developer, but are conditions that must be fulfilled in order to

receive the Restaurant Grant Payment. No later than December 31, 2026, Developer shall construct (or cause to be constructed) a structure or structures to house two food establishments that are neither a chicken restaurant or an establishment that sells only donuts and receive a certificate of occupancy for each. (By way of example, if donuts are sold, other food must also be available as well.) Developer shall also construct (or cause to be constructed) a cross access drive to the south of the property connecting to the parking lot located at 1001 N. Saginaw Blvd. Such drive must be accepted by the City and satisfy the City's standard detail specifications and build requirements.

C. **Section 5.2**. Section 5.2 is amended to read as follows:

- 5.2 Restaurant Grant Payment. Provided Developer is in compliance with each material term of this Agreement and has provided documentation satisfactory to the City showing the receipt of two Certificate of Occupancies for food establishments in accordance with Section 4.2 of this Agreement, and receives the City's final acceptance of the drive crossing, the City will make the Restaurant Grant Payment in the amount of Twenty-Seven Thousand and Eight Hundred Thirty Three Dollars (\$27,833) within thirty (30) days of compliance with this Section.
- D. Except as amended herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. This Second Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. The execution of this Second Amendment may be accomplished by facsimile or electronic signatures and shall be deemed fully executed upon the exchange among the Parties of signed facsimile or electronic copies of this Second Amendment.



3) Request: The applicant is requesting a zoning change to accommodate feedback received from the adjacent Spring Hollow neighborhood. In response, the developer has revised the site plan to relocate the drive accordingly. 





ORDINANCE NO. 2025-XX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2002-04, AS AMENDED, THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS, BY **AMENDING** COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN RELATING TO APPROXIMATELY 38.544 ACRES OUT OF THE FALCON SAGINAW DISTRIBUTION CENTER BLOCK 1, LOT 1, CITY OF SAGINAW, TARRANT COUNTY, TEXAS, AND LOCATED AT 112 SPRING HOLLOW DRIVE, IN SAGINAW, TEXAS; CHANGING THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION ON SAID PROPERTY FROM FROM SINGLE FAMILY (SF3) TO LIGHT INDUSTRIAL (LI); A CHANGE FROM LIGHT INDUSTRIAL (LI) TO SINGLE FAMILY (SF3); AND A CHANGE FROM COMMUNITY COMMERCIAL (CC) TO LIGHT INDUSTRIAL (LI) AND HEAVY INDUSTRIAL (HI); REVISING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE CUMULATIVE OF ALL ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY **CLAUSE**; **PROVIDING** Α **SAVINGS** PROVIDING A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Saginaw, Texas (the "City") is a home rule city acting under its charter adopted by the electorate pursuant to Article XI, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution and Chapter 9 of the Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2002-04, as amended, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Saginaw, which regulates and restricts the location and use of buildings, structures, and land for trade, industry, residence, and other purposes, and provides for the establishment of zoning districts of such number, shape, and area as may be best suited to carry out these regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously passed an ordinance adopting the 2022 Comprehensive Master Plan, as the primary document on which to base all zoning, platting, and other land use decisions; and

WHEREAS, the 2022 Comprehensive Master Plan provides guidance for future development in conformance with the Future Land Use Map; and

WHEREAS, the owner of certain property comprising approximately 38.544 acres of land and described as Falcon Saginaw Distribution Center Block 1, Lot 1, City of Saginaw, Tarrant County, Texas, and located at 112 Spring Hollow Drive, Saginaw, Texas, from its present classification of Single Family (SF3) to Light Industrial (LI); a change from Light Industrial (LI) to Single Family (SF3); and a change from Community Commercial (CC) to Light Industrial (LI) and Heavy Industrial (HI); and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the purpose and intent of the Zoning District herein granted is to provide for compatible land, building and structural uses

primarily oriented to commercial and residential uses; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City held a public hearing on November 11, 2025, and the City Council held a public hearing on November 18, 2025, with respect to the proposed zoning amendment as described herein; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that an amendment to the Future Land Use Map, as provided herein, rezoning the below described property from Single Family (SF3) to Light Industrial (LI); a change from Light Industrial (LI) to Single Family (SF3); and a change from Community Commercial (CC) to Light Industrial (LI) and Heavy Industrial (HI) is appropriate and is in accordance with growth goals, objectives, and planning principles set forth in the 2022 Comprehensive Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City has complied with all requirements of Chapter 211 of the Local Government Code and all other laws and regulations dealing with notice, publication, and procedural requirements for the approval of an amendment to the zoning on the property; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that amendment of the Zoning Regulations as outlined herein is in the best interest of the City and will promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the City and the general public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1.

The Saginaw, Texas, Comprehensive Land Use Plan, as amended, is hereby amended by changing the Future Land Use Map to change the land use designation of the property and area described below and located at 112 Spring Hollow Drive, Saginaw, Texas 76131:

Approximately 38.544 acres of land described as Falcon Saginaw Distribution Center Block 1, Lot 1, City of Saginaw, Tarrant County, Texas, as more particularly described on Exhibit "A," attached hereto.

SECTION 2.

The zoning districts as herein established have been made in accordance with a Comprehensive Land Use Plan for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the community.

SECTION 3.

The Official Zoning Map of the City is hereby amended and the City Secretary is hereafter directed to revise the Zoning Map to reflect the amendments as set forth above.

SECTION 4.

The City Secretary is directed to revise the Future Land Use Map to reflect the revised land use designations as set forth above.

SECTION 5.

The use of the property described above shall be subject to all of the applicable regulations contained in the Zoning Ordinance, and all other applicable and pertinent ordinances of the City of Saginaw.

SECTION 6.

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances and of the Saginaw City Code, as amended, except when the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances and such Code, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances and such Code are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared void, ineffective, or unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such voidness, ineffectiveness, or unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentence, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation herein of any such void, ineffective or unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 8.

All rights or remedies of the City are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the Saginaw City Code or any amendments thereto regarding zoning that have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and as to such accrued violations, and all pending litigation, both civil or criminal, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 9.

Any person, firm, or corporation who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects, or refuses to comply with or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine as provided in Section 1-13 of the Saginaw City Code. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 10.

The City Secretary of the City is hereby directed to publish at least twice in the official

newspaper of the City the caption and the penalty clause of this Ordinance in accordance with Section 52.013(b) of the Local Government Code.

SECTION 11.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Texas.



SECTION 1.

The Saginaw, Texas, Comprehensive Land Use Plan, as amended, is hereby amended by changing the Future Land Use Map to change the land use designation of the property and area described below and located at 304 E. McLeroy Blvd, Saginaw, Texas 76179:

Approximately 4.7033 acres of land described as Armendaris, Juan Survey Abstract 58 Tract 1A & 1A1 & Abst 119 Tr 1C, City of Saginaw, Tarrant County, Texas, as more particularly described on Exhibit "A," attached hereto.

SECTION 2.

The zoning districts as herein established have been made in accordance with a Comprehensive Land Use Plan for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the community.

SECTION 3.

The Official Zoning Map of the City is hereby amended and the City Secretary is hereafter directed to revise the Zoning Map to reflect the amendments as set forth above.

SECTION 4.

The City Secretary is directed to revise the Future Land Use Map to reflect the revised land use designations as set forth above.

SECTION 5.

The use of the property described above shall be subject to all of the applicable regulations contained in the Zoning Ordinance, and all other applicable and pertinent ordinances of the City of Saginaw.

SECTION 6.

The use of the property described above shall be subject to all the applicable regulations contained in the Zoning Ordinance and all other applicable and pertinent ordinances of the City of Saginaw.

SECTION 7.

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances and of the Saginaw City Code, as amended, except when the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances and such Code, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances and such Code are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared void, ineffective, or unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such voidness, ineffectiveness, or unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentence, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation herein of any such void, ineffective or unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 9.

All rights or remedies of the City are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the Saginaw City Code or any amendments thereto regarding zoning that have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and as to such accrued violations, and all pending litigation, both civil or criminal, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 10.

Any person, firm, or corporation who violates, disobeys, omits, neglects, or refuses to comply with or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine as provided in Section 1-13 of the Saginaw City Code. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 11.

The City Secretary of the City is hereby directed to publish at least twice in the official newspaper of the City the caption and the penalty clause of this Ordinance in accordance with Section 52.013(b) of the Local Government Code.

SECTION 12.





 - a. NC: Amend from permitted with a specific use permit to not permitted.
 - b. CC: Amend from permitted by right to permitted with a specific use permit.

- 6. Auto Sales, New & Used

Such facilities may be operated by a public agency or private entity in coordination with a transit provider and may include passenger shelters, waiting areas, bicycle parking, lighting, signage, and other amenities necessary to support transit operations. Park and ride lots shall not be used for vehicle maintenance, fueling, long-term storage, or unrelated commercial activities.
- b. Residential, OP, NC, NMU: Amend from permitted with a specific use permit to not permitted.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 5-1, "PERMITTED USE TABLE," OF ARTICLE 5, "PERMITTED USES," AND SECTION 8-9 "OFF-STREET PARKING AND LOADING REQUIREMENTS" OF ARTICLE 8, "SUPPLEMENTAL DISTRICT REGULATIONS," OF APPENDIX A, "ZONING," OF THE SAGINAW CITY CODE BY UPDATING THE PERMITTED USES FOR PARKING, MEDICAL USES, AUTOMOTIVE USES, AND COMMERCIAL, RETAIL, AND SERVICE USES; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE CUMULATIVE OF ALL ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Saginaw, Texas (the "City") is a home rule city acting under its Charter adopted by the electorate pursuant to Article XI, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution and Chapter 9 of the Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City has a substantial interest in protecting the health, safety, welfare, convenience, and enjoyment of the general public and has adopted zoning regulations to further this interest; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it appropriate to enact regulations regarding automotive uses, medical uses, commercial, retail, and service uses; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to amend the Permitted Use Table to accurately reflect those regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City held a public hearing on November 11, 2025, and the City Council of the City held a public hearing on November 18, 2025, with respect to the proposed textual amendments as described herein; and

WHEREAS, the City has complied with all requirements of Chapter 211 of the Local Government Code, City ordinances, and all other laws dealing with notice, publication, and procedural requirements for approval of a textual zoning amendment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the textual zoning amendment as outlined herein is in the best interest of the City and will promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the City and the general public; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2002-04, as amended, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Saginaw, which regulates and restricts the location and use of buildings, structures, and land for trade, industry, residence, and other purposes, and provides for the establishment of zoning districts of such number, shape, and area as may be best suited to carry out these regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council previously approved Ordinance 2023-17, which required that all commercial parking spaces be located on premises, and wish to update the Permitted Use Table to correctly reflect that SUPs may be granted in commercially zoned areas to allow for off-premises parking.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1.

Section 5-1, "Permitted use table," of Article 5, "Permitted Uses," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Saginaw City Code is hereby amended by revising and reordering the below-listed rows and titles of the City of Saginaw Land Use Table to read as follows:

Any rows in the City of Saginaw Land Use Table that have not been changed above will remain the same.

SECTION 2.

Section 8-9, "Off-street parking and loading requirements," of Article 8, "Supplemental District Regulations," of Appendix A, "Zoning," of the Saginaw City Code is hereby amended by revising Subsection A(4) to read as follows:

$\ \ \, \text{``Sec. 8-9.} - Of \textit{f-street parking and loading requirements.} \\$

4. On-premise parking required. All required residential parking spaces shall be located on the premises. All required commercial parking shall be located on the premises unless an SUP for off-premises parking has been granted."

SECTION 3.

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City and shall not repeal any of the provisions of such ordinances, except in those instances where provisions of such ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared void, ineffective, or unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such voidness, ineffectiveness, or unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation herein of any such void, ineffective or unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 5.

All rights or remedies of the City are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the Saginaw City Code or the Zoning Ordinance any amendments thereto that have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and as to such accrued violations, and all pending litigation, both civil or criminal, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 6.

Any person, firm, or corporation who violates any provision of this Ordinance, as adopted by the City Council of the City, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine as provided in Section 1-13 of the Saginaw City Code. Each

day any such violation or violations exist shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as such.

SECTION 7.

The City Secretary of the City is hereby directed to publish at least twice in the official newspaper of the City, the caption and the penalty clause of this Ordinance in accordance with Section 52.013(b) of the Local Government Code.

SECTION 8.

Subject: Request for Amendment to Sec. 8-9 - Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirements ("On-Premise Parking Required")

Dear Mayor Flippo,

DFW Plastics, Inc., a proud Saginaw business for over 27 years, respectfully submits this request for consideration of an amendment to the City Code, Section 8-9 ("Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirements"), specifically the provision that states:

"4. On-premise parking required. All required commercial and residential parking spaces shall be located on the premises."

Our request is based on the need to safely and efficiently expand our operations within our existing property boundaries while supporting the City's long-term goals for redevelopment and site improvement. The current ordinance requiring all parking to be located on the same premises limits our ability to utilize our site for operational growth, improved safety, and enhanced property presentation.

Rationale for Requested Change

DFW Plastics has been a fixture in Saginaw's industrial community for nearly three decades, employing local residents and contributing significantly to the local economy. As our operations continue to grow, we are implementing capital improvements aimed at:

- Expanding manufacturing capacity to meet rising customer demand.
- Improving on-site safety by separating pedestrian areas from active equipment zones.
- Enhancing efficiency of material flow, loading, and staging operations.

To achieve these objectives, our plan involves relocating employee parking to the adjacent lot we own across East Industrial Avenue. This relocation would:

- Improve safety by separating vehicular and industrial traffic.

- Align with the City's Building Improvement Grant Policy, allowing us
