A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS, CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING RESULTS OF AN ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAGINAW ON MAY 2, 2026 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 4 AND COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 6.

WHEREAS, on May 2, 2026, a general election was held for the offices of Councilmember Place 4 and Councilmember Place 6; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly held at the time and place specified, after notice as required by law had been given by posting and publication; and

WHEREAS, the City has created one municipal precinct comprised of the entire City; and

WHEREAS, the Council has been presented a tabulation of the total number of votes for the precinct and each candidate; and

WHEREAS, there were 1,535 electors voting at said election, who cast votes as follows:

FOR COUNCILMEMBER PLACE NO. 4

Brack St. Clair	719 Votes
Brian Thompson	619 Votes

FOR COUNCILMEMBER PLACE NO.6

Benjamin Guttery	536 Votes
Mary Copeland	861 Votes

as is reflected by the election returns heretofore filed by the election judges with the City Secretary; and

WHEREAS, only qualified voters of the City of Saginaw, Texas, were allowed to vote in said election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAGINAW, TEXAS THAT:

1. Said election was duly called; that notice of said election was given in accordance with the Texas Election Code (the "Code") the City passed a resolution calling the election; that the election was held in accordance with the Code; that due return of said election has been made by the proper officers; and that the qualified voters of the City of Saginaw, Texas, voting in said election have

duly elected Brack St. Clair as Councilmember Place No. 4, and Mary Copeland as Councilmember Place No. 6.

2. That the said Brack St. Clair is hereby declared duly elected to the office of Councilmember Place No. 4 of the City of Saginaw, Texas for a three year term expiring in 2029.

3. That the said Mary Copeland is hereby declared duly elected to the office of Councilmember Place No. 6 of the City of Saginaw, Texas for a three year term expiring in 2029.

4. That the proper officials are hereby authorized to administer the oath of office and do all things necessary to install said officers in their respective office.
