

Ivins No-Kill Animal Supporters (INKAS) is a 501(c)3 organization and a Registered Utah Charity. It was founded in 2010 with the mission of providing support to Ivins Animal Shelter and Adoption Center, now the Santa Clara-Ivins Animal Shelter. In 2006 our shelter became the first no-kill municipal shelter in the state of Utah. Maintaining a no-kill shelter, as opposed to one that euthanizes animals after a set period of time, is more costly because the animals' needs must be met at the shelter until they are reclaimed by their owners, adopted or transferred to an animal rescue organization. Through a memorandum of understanding with Ivins City, INKAS provides support through veterinary care, specialty foods and other needed supplies. Funds are raised through the sale of merchandise at various local events and through the donations of many generous animal lovers. You can help by making a donation on our website: inkas4pets.org.

BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS:

2023 Business License renewal notices were sent out in early December; business license renewals were due January 31, 2023. Please renew now if you have not already done so; make sure your Department of Commerce entity registration and all state licenses required for your business are current and provided with your renewal.

Daycare, childcare, preschools, and commercial businesses must have their annual Fire Safety Inspection completed and passed to receive their 2023 business license; call 435-673-6712 EXT 330 to schedule the fire safety inspection. For business license renewal questions please call 673-6712 EXT 201 or 210. A \$25 late fee is applicable for late renewals.

DOG LICENSES:

2023 Dog Licenses are available at the Town Hall office. Proof of your dog's current rabies vaccination is required for licensing. License fees are as follows:

1st Dog Fixed: \$10.00 Not Fixed: \$20.00
2nd Dog Fixed: \$12.00 Not Fixed: \$22.00



City ordinance requires that you license your dog(s) annually. The dog license and rabies vaccination tag should be worn on your dog's collar on your dog. If your dog is found at large the city tag makes it easy to identify the owner and return your pet to you. You can call the city office to pay the license fee and have the license and tag mailed to you as long as we have a current rabies vaccination certificate on hand. Late fees are applicable after Feb 28th.



CEMETERY CLEAN-UP WINTER 2023:

There are three regularly scheduled cemetery clean ups each year. They begin on the first Monday of February, May, and November. The 2023 Winter Clean-up will begin on Monday February 6, 2023.

All flowers and decorations of any kind should be removed from the cemetery before that date. Remaining flowers and decorations will be removed and disposed of, with the exception of new burials. Flowers and decorations can be returned to the cemetery Friday February 10th. Thank you for helping to keep the cemetery a beautiful place of remembrance.
